

PBC worship – Worship leader

Description

Worship leaders hold important positions of influence and authority at PBC. With deep Biblical grounding, worship leaders carry spiritual authority in leading the community of PBC into curated spaces of worship.

Support & accountability

The training of individual worship leaders will be overseen by the worship pastor and may involve experienced worship leaders on an individual basis. The worship pastor will be contactable during the preparation and facilitation stages of worship leading should problems arise or questions be asked. The worship leader is also accountable to the worship pastor for their character and conduct in line with agreed codes of conduct.

Responsibilities & expectations

The role of worship leader involves the following expectations and responsibilities:

Preparation

- Choosing songs: choosing sets and individual songs that form the worship service. This will respect the approved list of songs and will be done with the support and feedback of the worship pastor.
- Communication: communicating songs with the band in an appropriate way.
- Arrive onsite 15mins before the band (7am or 3.15pm) to ensure music is available and band are supported on arrival.

Facilitation

- Leading the worship band practice before the service – communicating effectively with band members for desired outcomes.
- Communicating with the rostered sound operators – setting a positive tone for the band that supports the sound operators in their role.
- Communicating with the rostered computer operators – to ensure song structures & orders are understood and ready.
- Lead the sung praise and worship portions of the rostered services (including calls to worship, prayers and other components that fall within or surround worship sets).

Rostering

- If unavailable for a rostered service, the worship leader needs to contact the worship pastor directly and organise a swap with another worship leader where possible.

Worship leader team

- Be an active part of the worship leader team, attending relevant meetings, sharing reflections, and supporting other worship leaders where possible.
